Guess what the animal is!	4 When driving in the car, turn off the radio and sing some songs with your child.	5 Re-read your child's favorite books and let them finish well known sentences.	6 Practice writing the letter J for June. What other words start with J?
7 Make funny faces. It helps kids read facial expressions and is fun!	8 Give your child a bowl and ask them to fill it with toys. How many toys will fill it up?	9 Place a dried bean and a damp paper towel in a zip top bag. Tape in a sunny window and watch what happens.	10 Tell your child a story about a pet you had (or wished you had) growing up.	11 Listen to "Run, Baby, Run" by Caspar Babypants.	12 Before reading, look at the cover and predict what the book might be about.	13 Play outside with chalk. What shapes and letters can you make?
14 Play with fabric or scarves (with supervision). Look at color and pattern. What do you see?	15 Find things shaped like a circle in your house or when you're outside.	16 Put a sugar cube in hot water. What happens? Does it do the same in cold water?	17 How many words can you think of that rhyme with "sun"?	18 Name one of your child's favorite musical movies and sing a song from it.	19 Read a book about summer! It starts on Sunday!	20 Draw a picture of the things you want to do this summer.
21 It's the first day of summer! If the sun is out, go out and make silly shadows.	22 Walk around the house and ask your child to name all the yellow items they see.	23 Go on a sound scavenger hunt. Pick out the sounds before you go and listen carefully while you walk.	25 When at the grocery store, talk about the items you are choosing. Is it in a can or a box?	26 How loudly can you sing your favorite song? How quietly?	27 Go outside and read a book on a beach towel.	28 Write a color word on a piece of white paper. Have your child use only that color to draw.
